New route and road closures in Canary Wharf for 2025



The 2025 TCS London Marathon on Sunday 27 April

The 45th annual edition of the London Marathon takes place on Sunday 27 April 2025 and will require road closures and parking restrictions in your area. This leaflet provides details of the closures. Local information for residents and businesses

CANARY WHARF

This year, the course will use several different roads in Canary Wharf, including Montgomery Street, Water Street and Charter Street.

CUTTY SARK DLR STATION

Cutty Sark Docklands Light Railway (DLR) station will be entry only on Sunday 27 April. Passengers will not be able to get off trains or leave the station, and only northbound services will operate.

GREENWICH FOOT TUNNEL

The Greenwich Foot Tunnel will be open south to north throughout Marathon Day. However, it will be busy with queues anticipated. The tunnel will be closed north to south between 10:30 and 12:30. Alternative arrangements are in place on the DLR services from Island Gardens.

ROTHERHITHE

In conjunction with Bacon's College, there will once again be a scheme that will enable residents of the Rotherhithe Peninsula to exit the area while the event road closures are in place.

The college, on Timber Pond Road, will provide free, secure, overnight parking on its premises for use by local residents.

The car park will operate from 16:00 on Saturday 26 April until 18:30 on Sunday 27 April. Residents can leave their vehicle parked and return on foot at any time during the road closure period to collect the vehicle and exit the peninsula.

From the college, the route out is via Timber Pond Road, Poolmans Street, Needleman Street, Surrey Quays Road and Lower Road.

Residents requiring access should use Hawkstone Road, Lower Road, Surrey Quays Road, Needleman Street, Poolmans Street and Timber Pond Road, and may leave their vehicle at Bacon's College until the roads reopen.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Please assist us by parking your vehicle off the route on the evening of Saturday 26 April.

Vehicle removals will start at 04:00 on Sunday 27 April.

If your vehicle is relocated by event contractors, visit trace.london to find it.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

ISLE OF DOGS

Roads on the Isle of Dogs will close at 08:00 and reopen at 20:30 on Sunday 27 April.

Event motorcyclists, assisted by stewards, will be available to guide vehicles along Westferry Road when it is safe to do so before 08:30 and after 17:30 only. Drivers will be unable to return to Westferry Road until the roads are reopened.

WAPPING

Residents of Wapping are affected by the route as it passes along The Highway between Miles 13 and 14 and again on the opposite carriageway between Miles 21 and 22.

A Vehicle Crossing Point will operate at the junction of The Highway and Glamis Road during the road closure period, allowing entry and exit north and south.

Vehicles will NOT be able to cross while there are participants on both carriageways of The Highway (between approximately 09:15 and 16:30 on Sunday 27 April).

We advise residents travelling on foot to use the pedestrian subway at the junction of The Highway and Glamis Road.

WESTMINSTER

The following extended closure and reopening times will be in place in Westminster:

THE MALL AND MARLBOROUGH ROAD: Closed from 05:00 on Thursday 24 April. Reopened at 18:00 on Monday 28 April.

SPUR ROAD, CONSTITUTION HILL, HORSE GUARDS ROAD AND BIRDCAGE WALK (EASTBOUND): Closed from 06:00 on Friday 25 April. Reopened at 06:00 on Monday 28 April.

BIRDCAGE WALK (WESTBOUND) Birdcage Walk will be open for westbound traffic until 06:00 on Saturday 26 April, when it will be closed. It will reopen at 06:00 on Monday 28 April.

TCS Mini London Marathon on Saturday 26 April

St James's Park will host the TCS Mini London Marathon on Saturday 26 April.

Northumberland Avenue, Great Scotland Yard, and Whitehall Place will be closed from 07:00 to 11:00.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

UNDERGROUND/TRAINS/DLR

London Underground, London Overground and the Docklands Light Railway (DLR) all have extra services on Marathon Day, and they are by far the best way to get around.

London Underground services in central areas will be running as usual, but they are likely to be extremely busy.

The Jubilee, Circle and District lines, and DLR, have stops close to the marathon route and are likely to be busier than usual.

BUSES

Buses travelling on roads affected by the marathon will either be diverted or will not run the full length of their route until after the event.

SANTANDER CYCLES

Some Santander Cycles docking stations located on the event route will be suspended from Saturday evening until Sunday evening.

RIVER SERVICES

Thames Clippers will be running services from central London to Greenwich Pier, where it's just a short walk to the Start at Blackheath/Greenwich Park. For more information, visit thamesclippers.com
